

# **MBSS Course Policy**

**Grade 10**: 8 courses inside timetable <u>NO SPARES</u>

**Grade 11**: 8 courses inside timetable NO SPARES

**Grade 12**: 6/8 courses inside timetable

3 course minimum per semester

Outside the timetable (OTT) courses counted separately

Online courses are 'extra' and are <u>not</u> part of timetable course count. You will not get a spare if you choose an online course.



# Plan Carefully!

- Course Selection: Talk, research and choose!
- What you choose now will impact what courses we offer, and will shape your schedule in September!
- Make thoughtful choices keep doors open for the future!

Changing courses will NOT be simple and extra space in any course is not guaranteed.




