Procedure:

- 1. Run 1.5 miles (6 laps of a 400 metre track) in less than 15 minutes
- 2. Perform the maximum number of full body push-ups (from toes) in 60 seconds. Minimum number 15 reps
- 3. Perform the maximum number of sit-ups in 60 seconds minimum 30 reps, or perform the maximum number of partial curl-ups minimum 25 reps
