




Language Arts Pathways






Social Studies Pathways







Grade 12: 6/8 courses minimum inside timetable

3 course minimum per semester

*Outside the timetable (OTT) courses counted separately

Online courses are 'extra' and are <u>not</u> part of timetable course count. You will not get a spare if you choose to take an online course.



Plan Carefully !!!


- COURSE SELECTION: Talk, research, & choose!
